Like no other destination, the Dominican Republic is a sensual feast of stunning landscapes, exotic dining, and a remarkable variety of arts and entertainment options.

The pulse-pounding thrill of the merengue, intriguing artifacts from centuries past, premium cigars, and even world-class baseball await your guests. The Dominican Republic is a surprising place that will delight even the most experienced traveler.





A Travel Pro Knows - Overview



Climate

Dominican Republic has year-round temperatures averaging around 25°C(77° F), making any time of year a good time to visit. Due to the warm and sunny conditions experienced almost everywhere in the country, some call the climate 'the endless summer'.

The cool season runs from November through April when lower humidity prevails, and the evenings are much cooler than in the summer months.

The more mountainous interior is considerably cooler, and temperatures have been known to drop below freezing, with frost visible on the mountain tops.

The Dominican Republic R is susceptible to hurricanes during the summer months (June – October). Historically, the Dominican Republic's peak hurricane activity has been in August and September.



Currency

The currency is the Dominican Republic Peso (DOP). You can change currency upon arrival at the airport, but may not be able to change back upon departure. Major credit cards and travelers checks are accepted at most major tourist areas in the country. ATMs may be found in cities and most resorts; they aren't as readily accessible as in the US. Avoid carrying large amounts of cash (use the in-room safes or safety deposit boxes provided by most resorts).



Electricity

Electricity is 110 volts AC, as it is in the continental United States and Canada.



Health

Malaria can be an issue around rainforests if travelers don't take protective measures such as repellents against mosquito bites. Many of the local foods are safe to eat including the meats, fruits, and vegetables. Visitors, however, should not drink any of the local water and should stay with bottled water or other beverages. Sunburn and sun poisoning are a great risk. Use at least SPF30 sunblock.



Language

The official language of the Dominican Republic is Spanish. You will find some Spanish-English bilingual locals especially in Santo Domingo and tourist areas.



Time zone

Dominican Republic is 4 hours behind of GMT



What to Pack

Geography

The Dominican Republic is situated on the eastern part of the second-largest island in the Greater Antilles, Hispaniola. It shares the island roughly at a 2:1 ratio with Haiti. The country's area is reported variously as 48,442 km² (by the embassy in the United States) and 48,730 km² (by the U.S. CIA), making it the second largest country in the Antilles, after Cuba. The country's capital and greatest metropolitan area, Santo Domingo, is located on the southern coast.





Culture & Social Conventions

Dominicans are kind and peaceful people. Attempts at speaking Spanish are a good sign of respect for the local people. Be polite, show respect, and do your best to speak the language, and you will be treated with kindness.

Avoid talking about Haiti. Although relations have improved, many Dominicans, particularly of the older generations, harbor resentment towards Haitians.

Greetings

Man greeting Man - Men shake hands when greeting one another and maintain direct eye contact. At a first meeting a warm handshake will suffice and is sometimes combined with slight touches on the arms and/or elbows. Handshakes may linger a bit. Good friends and family will engage in a firm hug which may be combined with a few slaps on the back.

Woman greeting Woman - At a first meeting, women generally shake hands. Friends and close acquaintances kiss each other once on the cheek.

Man greeting Woman - At a first meeting a regular handshake will do. Friends, family and close acquaintances usually share a light kiss on the cheek.

Gift Giving - Gifts are not usually brought to a first meeting. If invited to a Dominican's house, it is appropriate to bring flowers (avoid black and purple as they are funeral colors), wine, spirits, or chocolates. Make sure that gifts are nicely wrapped and they are usually to be opened right away.

Communications Style

Dominicans tend to be quite open and direct in conversations. Asking personal questions during a first meeting, like how many children you have, how old you are, etc., is quite common.

Until you get to know someone better, it is best to avoid talking about politics, religion, and relations with Haiti.

Humor and laughter play a big role in communicating. Dominicans tend to be quite happy people.



A trip to Dominican Republic is not complete without experiencing some of the unique cuisine. Here are a few items to try:

Tipping:

Restaurants will add 10% gratuity to the bill, it is customary to give a bit more – up to an additional 10%. Tips should be given to taxi drivers, hotel maids (even at all inclusive resorts), and bell men.

Dominicans enjoy an array of foods as colorful as the landscape, but simple in taste. Dominican cuisine stems from native Antillean and hearty Creole recipes and is prepared similar to the dishes of Central and South America with rice, fish and other seafoods, meats or vegetables. Light spices or coconut add depth and warm the soul.

Traditional Fare: Breakfast typically calls for a serving of "Mangu," a mix of plantains, cheese and bacon, which can be found at most hotel and resort restaurants, a must-try for all visitors.

"La Bandera Dominicana," or the Dominican flag meal, is eaten by nearly everyone at lunch time.

The most important meal of the day, La Bandera consists of rice, beans, meat, vegetables and fried plantains to ensure energy throughout the afternoon and evening.

"Sancocho," a Spanish-style stew usually served with rice, whose ingredients include various roots, green plantains, avocado and typically chicken or beef, although it sometimes includes a combination of seven meats (Sancocho prieto). Goat meat, a staple in many Dominican homes, may also be used in this recipe.

Other favorite Dominican dishes include:

- "chicharrones de pollo" (diced chunks of deep fried chicken)
- "monfogo" (plantain based dish)
- •" ropo vieja" (seasoned and fried shredded beef served with rice and a side salad)
- "pastelitos" (meat-or -cheese filled pastry turnovers).

Desserts : A proper Dominican meal is not complete without dessert. In a land abundant with sugar cane, most desserts are exceptionally sweet. Cakes, puddings, caramel-dipped fruits and creams are common.





Economy & Industry - Overview

The Dominican Republic has long been viewed primarily as an exporter of sugar, coffee, and tobacco, but in recent years the service sector has overtaken agriculture as the economy's largest employer, due to growth in telecommunications, tourism, and free trade zones.

The economy is highly dependent upon the US, the destination for nearly 60% of exports. Remittances from the US amount to about a 10th of GDP, equivalent to almost half of exports and three-quarters of tourism receipts. The country suffers from marked income inequality; the poorest half of the population receives less than one-fifth of GDP, while the richest 10% enjoys nearly 40% of GDP.

High unemployment and underemployment remains an important long-term challenge. The Central America-Dominican Republic Free Trade Agreement (CAFTA-DR) came into force in March 2007, boosting investment and exports and reducing losses to the Asian garment industry.

The growth of the Dominican Republic's economy rebounded in 2010-11 from the global recession, and remains one of the fastest growing in the region. Industries:

tourism, sugar processing, ferronickel and gold mining, textiles, cement, tobacco

Santo Domingo



Santo Domingo is one of the Caribbean's most vibrant cities. Founded by Bartholomeo Columbus, brother of Christopher, in 1496. It's the oldest city in the New World and the capital of the Dominican Republic.

The city today still reflects its long history - French, Haitian, and especially Spanish.

Don't miss:

The 12-block Colonial Zone where Cortés, Ponce de León, and, of course, Columbus himself walked.

Allow at least a day to capture some of the highlights of the old city such as its Alcazar and its Catedral Santa Maria la Menor.

Shopping bazaars with such "hot" items as hand-wrapped cigars, local handicrafts, jewelry made of larimar or amber,

La Romana



La Romana has become one of the most popular tourist destinations in the country because of the beautiful beaches and the tourism infrastructure that has been put in place.

Altos De Chavón River View: it is a replica of a 17th century Mediterranean village located just minutes from La Romana. Here you'll find artists' studios, craft-shops, galleries, restaurants and bars to satisfy all types of visitors. Take in a show at their 5000 seat amphitheater that still attracts big name artists.

Altos de Chavón is one of those must-visit locations on a trip to La Romana All Inclusive Resorts.



Puerto Plata



Puerto Plata appeals to a mass-market crowd that prefers less-expensive allinclusives. More accommodations of this kind continue to pop up on this coast, and yet many are still booked solid almost year-round. An unfortunate byproduct of the all-inclusive trend is that several excellent restaurants have been forced to close; in fact, the most popular dining choice along the coast now is Pizza Hut.

Most of the hotels are not actually in Puerto Plata itself but in a tourist zone called Playa Dorada, which consists of major hotels, a scattering of secluded condominiums and villas, a Robert Trent Jones, Jr.-designed golf course, and a riding stable.

Although this was the first custom-built tourist haven in the Dominican Republic, the beaches are not the greatest. They're relatively narrow, and subject to hurricane erosion. The beach is shared with the residents of at least nine hotels, all jostling for position. However, if they enjoy beige sand that's rarely too hot to walk on, and a never-ending array of watersports kiosks, chaise lounges, and loudspeakers projecting merengue music, they'll be happy here. One important note: It rains a lot in Puerto Plata during the winter. If your customers want guaranteed sun, go to Punta Cana or the beaches on the southern coast.

Sales Tips: Although most tourists to Puerto Plata are quite content to stay firmly put at their beachside all-inclusive resort, if they do want to explore other beaches check out Cabarete, about 19 miles east of Puerto Plata. It's famous for having nearly two miles of sand and is a world-renowned windsurfing capital.

Although swimsuits and shorts are fine for the beach areas, casual slacks and sundresses are more culturally appropriate in the city.

The fair-skinned or sun-adverse will enjoy Guarapitao Beach, just to the west of Puerto Plata, with its plentiful shade.



Punta Cana



Punta Cana is the name of a region in the easternmost tip of the Dominican Republic. Covering approximately 1,100 acres, the region is home to a coastline of sandy white beaches and to a "town" of the same name.

Located in the province of La Altagracia and population estimated at 100,000, the region borders the Atlantic Ocean to the east. To the north, it borders Bávaro and El Cortecito beaches.

Despite the area being fairly deserted, the proximity of Punta Cana to other major resort areas such as Bávaro and Uvero Alto make the town one of the top Caribbean destinations.

Peak Season: Peak season in Punta Cana tends to run from December to April. Prices in both airfare and hotel increase dramatically during these times, while dropping in the summer and early fall months.

The resorts are low-rise and beautiful. The grounds are lush and tropical with foliage, lagoons and palm trees along with peacocks, ducks, parrots and other wildlife that stroll the resorts' grounds. The majority of the resorts are very large and spread out – like small cities. This means lots of walking.

Some resorts have golf carts and trams to accommodate guests' needs. Punta Cana has so many great resorts that will meet every expectation: golf, scuba, fishing, windsailing, yachting, fine dining, relaxation, spas, children's programs and more.



Playa del Macao



The gorgeous Dominican Republic beaches at Playa del Macao are perfectly suited for catching some rays or for enjoying some of the area's best surfing.

With nice strings of waves routinely rolling to shore, the chances of landing a killer tube are very good.

There is even a shipwreck nearby where scuba diving classes are regularly held. For an enchanting time, visit the small fishing village of El Macao for a taste of the Dominican Republic's past.



Lago Enriquillo is a huge salt-water lake that is also home to one of the area's largest wild reserves and bird sanctuaries.

A natural beauty of unspoiled splendor, visitors will be able to see colorful flamingos, lazy iguanas, captivating crocodiles and many other fascinating creatures in their own habitat.



Eastern National Park



Eastern National Park, also known as Parque Nacional del Este, is one of the largest marine parks in the Caribbean and home to 112 different bird species.

It's also a prime ecosystem for hundreds of other creatures. There are many local caves where visitors can take in early cave drawings and the offshore coral reef system offers a gorgeous place to dive.

The park is also home to a few very remote beaches for the perfect romantic getaway.

Basilica de Nuestra Senora



One of the finest displays of modern Christian architecture, the Basilica de Nuestra Senora is a beloved church and an impressive sight.

Every year on January 21, a pilgrimage across the country makes its way to attend Mass here.



Museum of the Royal Houses



This epic museum in Santa Domingo was at one time the colonial administrative center for all of the Spanish West Indies. Today, it exists as a museum dedicated to preserving many of the artifacts and items from that time in history

First Cathedral of America



Located in Santa Domingo, the Catedral Primada de America is the oldest cathedral in the Americas. Built between 1514 and 1544, the cathedral radiates gothic ambiance throughout its Renaissance-styled decor.

The church is also known as the Cathedral of Santa Maria and it was once the resting place of Christopher Columbus.



Plaza De la Cultura



The Plaza De la Cultura is a park in Santa Domingo that is filled with various museums and art galleries. For a cultural slice of the Dominican Republic, this is the place to go.

Many of the local heritage houses have been renovated and now serve as delightful restaurants.

Amber Museum



Amber is the designated gem of the Dominican Republic and the Amber Museum, located in Puerto Plata, is the best place to see some truly magnificent specimens. Set in an old Victorian-style house, the museum also has a gift shop where you can pick up a necklace or other pieces of fine jewelry crafted from true, golden Amber.



Mount Isabel de Torres



Located in Puerto Plata, a visit to Mount Isabel de Torres provides some spectacular sights. Have your camera ready as your trip begins with a cable car ride to the top.

Once at the top, you can expect an incredible view of the Dominican Republic geography, stand in the shadow of the huge statue of Christ and enjoy a heavenly botanical garden full of blooming flowers. There's even a restaurant should hunger strike.

Altos de Chavon



Altos de Chavon is a replica of a 16th century Spanish village. Scenically located atop the cliffs overlooking the Chavon River, the village is home to numerous art galleries, shops and an archeological museum.





The Dominican Republic is one of the few countries in the Caribbean with nine ecological zones. This diversity plays a major role in making eco and adventure tourism in the country so remarkable and exciting.

The Dominican Republic has the highest and lowest sea level points in the Caribbean with Pico Duarte at 10,128 feet above and Lake Enriguillo at 144 feet below. In between these elevations is a playground of environments from tropical rainforest to arid desert. These areas are matched with adventures and activities designed to get adrenaline rushing, hearts racing and senses bursting.

The Dominican Republic is a haven for birdwatchers:

- Over 300 species of brightly colored birds that call the island home either permanently or as a migration layover.
- 27 species are only found on the island of Hispaniola.
- Another 15 species are either endangered or threatened -- including the bay-breasted cuckoo, LaSelle thrush and Hispaniolan crossbill.

The Southwestern Region is very popular with birders because it combines a semi-desert zone with coast, lagoons, islands, lakes and cliffs, providing a diverse habitat for a large variety of birds. More than 130 species are located in the Jaragua National Park alone.







There are no official campgrounds in the Dominican Republic. However, for those looking for a more rugged camping adventure, the country presents some unique opportunities for camping in its national parks and on a few uninhabited islands. The following are three of the most popular areas for a more primal experience:

Pico Duarte in the central mountains

Tent camping is allowed just about anywhere in Armando Bermudez National Park. It is here that visitors can find Pico Duarte. The Dominican Republic asks that campers try to use pre-existing sites. Rustic cabins are available in the Valley de Tetero and along its main trail. A park permit, which costs approximately \$5, and a local guide are required by the national parks office. Both are available at the Amando Bermudez National Park entrance.

Cayo Levantado on the Samana Peninsula

Camping is allowed on the remote side of the island, which is accessible by a \$40 roundtrip ferry ride from the main port of Samana. Permission to camp is required from authorities located at the port. A permit fee of \$5 will be charged. Victoria Marina can also provide permits and transportation to the island.

Isla Catalina near La Romana

This small island off the coast of La Romana has just a couple of pavilions and a restaurant, giving visitors the feeling of being on a neardeserted island. Far from the main dock is an area of virgin beach where camping is allowed. A permit must be obtained from the national parks office in Bayahibe, where shuttle boats to the island can also be hired.



Outdoor Recreation – Canyoning/ Cascading & Rock Climbing

Canyoning is a blend of hiking, swimming, rock climbing, jumping and repelling and usually ends with a dip in a cool mountain pool. On the North coast, tours or guides operate out of Cabarete.

A highlight for canyoners is the Jimenoa River area of the central region. Starting at the headwaters of the river, participants descend through canyons and end at Jimenoa falls. The riverbed winds down along the virgin woods that blanket this colossal mountain range.

Cascading is a variant that uses little equipment and requires the partaker to "cascade" by making multiple jumps with at least one through a waterfall and into the pool at its bottom. The Salto de Jimenoa waterfall is a recommended spot but the pinnacle cascading course is Damajagua, near Puerto Plata. This series of falls has 28 water jumps if the entire journey is completed.

Rock Climbing

The Dominican Republic is considered to be one of the world's best rocking destinations among those who know the rope. With four mountain ranges, the country provides a great landscape for adrenaline.

One of the best spots is Playa El Fronton, which is easily accessible by boat from Las Galeras. Climbers hire a boat for around \$30 that will take them to a drop-off point and wait until their return. Other popular areas for rock climbing are Parque Mirador del Este near Santo Domingo and Barahona in the southwest region.





There are hundreds of caves spread throughout the Dominican Republic, the majority of which are located in the country's numerous national parks. Many tour companies offer caving excursions. Tours out of Punta Cana ride horseback through Los Haitises National Park to the mouth of <u>Fun Fun Cave</u>. Participants start the tour by descending on a rope with a free fall of more than 60 feet into the cave. Once in the dwelling, people can explore colorful tunnels and mystical underground rivers.



Nature Enthusiasts – Fourwheeling/ATVs & Monster Truck/Off-Road Runner Tours

Four-wheeling/ATVs

Cruising on the rough roads of the Dominican countryside, the ATVs set course through tropical woods and rushing rivers. Riders are sure to get wet if not from the river, then by a visit to Baiguate and Jimenoa waterfalls on the Jarabacoa tour.

For those heading out of Punta Cana, the half-day adventure begins in Macao village and continues along the beach of the same name. Riders may want to jump in the ocean to cool down or lounge on the seven miles of unspoiled beach. The Puerto Plata tour explores the slopes of Isabel de Torres mountain with a stop at a river for swimming. Several areas are visited including sugar cane plantations and a semi-desert beach called "Bergantin" for a second chance to swim.



Monster Truck Safari

(Near both Puerto Plata and Punta Cana) This full-day adventure tour allows participants to experience the diversity and beauty of the Dominican countryside in a fun, comfortable and safe environment. Available online on Orbitz & CheapTickets.

Insider's Tip: Many tourists enjoy bringing small gifts with them on the Monster Truck Safari for distribution to Dominican children in remote villages. These gifts may include pens, crayons, clothing and small toys.



Outdoor Recreation – Mountain Biking & Mountain Climbing

Mountain Biking

Mountain biking is one of the quietest and most exhilarating ways to see the DR. The bikes allow tourists to reach places not accessible to most visitors. Several tour companies, such as Iguana Mama, offer one-day to multi-day tours out of Cabarete.

Mountain Climbing on Pico Duarte

Climbing Pico Duarte is not for the weak. With a peak reaching 10,128 feet above sea level, the mountain is the highest in the Caribbean. As part of the "Dominican Alps," the climb is strenuous but achievable, especially with the assistance of a guide and a mule to carry packs up the mountain. While the guide is required, the mule is optional though highly recommended. Both can be arranged at the village of La Cienaga just outside the Armando Bermudez National Park. The walk to the top of the mountain and back usually takes three days from the village.






Outdoor Recreation – Glassbottom Boats & Whale Watching

Glass-bottom Boats

Available by an official tour operator, this is the fastest way to reach the reefs for snorkeling. It's also a great way to see the reefs if tourists prefer to stay dry. Visitors can expect to pay approximately \$15 per person. Glass bottom boats can also be arranged in Punta Cana through the hotels.

Whale watching

From January through March, Samana Bay is nearly taken over by humpback whales. For centuries, thousands of these humungous mammals make an annual trip to spend winter in the warm waters of the Dominican Republic. Tours from Samana Bay are available during this time and most offer a 99 percent sighting rate.





Outdoor Recreation – Helicopter Tours

The Dominican Republic's coastlines are some of the most beautiful in the Caribbean thanks to an expansive coral system, unending beaches and lush jungle forests. And there's no better way to see it than by air. Helicopter tours from 10, 20 and 30 minutes are available throughout the country and some operators will create a personalized experience.





Outdoor Recreation – Hiking & Horseback Riding

Hiking

Abundant trails line the countryside of the Dominican Republic with the most famous leading to Pico Duarte. Most paths are located within the national parks system and require permits from the government in order to be explored. Some trails also request that a certifiable guide accompany hikers. Guides can often be secured near the entrances of the national parks. The most popular trails can be found at Jarabacoa, Constanza, Parque Nacional Monte Cristi, Pico Isabel del Torres, Punta Bonita, Parque Nacional del Este, San Rafael and Parque Nacional Bahoruco.

Horseback Riding

Many tours include horseback riding as a part of the transportation to reach points of interest. But for equestrians seeking a longer, more concentrated time with a horse, the northern mountain range of the Domincan Republic can provide an ideal arena. Several companies have one-day tours using the strong Creole mountain breed of horse that will take riders over the mountains, through rivers and dense jungles and will stop along the way for waterfall and cave exploration.





Outdoor Recreation – Island Exploring

Isla Saona

The most popular section of Parque Nacional del Este, Isla Saona has been described as a "Robinson Crusoe" fantasy come true. Several tour operators have trips out of Punta Cana, Santo Domingo, La Romana and Bayahibe. Full-day tours to the island are available out of Puerto Plata and include a 40-minute flight to La Romana with a stop at the Mediterranean-styled village of Altos de Chavon.

Isla Catalina

Tours to Isla Catalina, a sixsquare mile island found in the Parque Nacional del Este, leave the port of La Romana by speed boat. Many of the tours also visit Altos de Chavon at Casa de Campo and Isla Saona. Tours to the area from Punta Cana travel via boat along the coastline.

Cayo Leventado

The six-square mile raised coral key is known as "Bacardi Island" having served as the backdrop for the company's advertising campaign in the 1970s. Located in the Bay of Samana, the island features rich vegetation, fishing and snorkeling. Tours can be arranged out of Samana and Puerto Plata.

Cayo Arena

Also known as Cayo Paraiso, it's one of the driest zones of the DR. Tours travel to the small fishing village of Punta Rusia and from there a boat is taken to the island. Colorful mangroves greet visitors as they disembark from the launch. This is a prime area for a chance to see a manatee a mammal that inhabits the island. Other activities include sun worshiping on the sand and snorkeling or scuba diving among the network of 250 coral reefs. Tours are available out of Puerto Plata.



Outdoor Recreation – Jeep Safaris

Jeep Safaris and Expeditions place visitors behind the wheel of their own fourby-four Jeep or "fun truck" on the rustic roads of the DR. This is the best way to find secluded beaches and learn about local customs while being surrounded by lush vegetation. Tours are out of Samana, Punta Cana and Puerto Plata and often include horseback riding as an option.





Outdoor Recreation – Kayaking & Whitewater Rafting

Whitewater Rafting

White water flows from the mountains through canyons and jungle and out to sea. The hottest white water rafting location is on the Yaque del Norte in the central mountain area. This is the largest river in the DR and has exhilarating class III to V rapids (using the universal scale of I to VI) including a 12-foot drop named "Mike Tyson." Most tours will only allow adults and children over 12 years of age who are in good health.

Kayaking

Like whitewater rafting, kayaking is most popular in the central region along the Yaque del Norte and Jimenoa rivers near Jarabacoa. Both waterways provide a mix of white water with sharp turns and precipitous drops. Intermediate kayakers will enjoy the challenge of class III and IV rapids, while those with more experience can tackle the advanced sections of class V rapids.





Outdoor Recreation – Kiteboarding – Sandboarding - Surfing -Windsurfing

The Dominican Republic is known as the kiteboarding capital of the world among those who travel the water sports circuit. In fact, the Kiteboarding World Cup has been held in the Dominican Republic town of Cabarete the past four years.

In this area on the North Coast, the perfect blend of wind, water and waves create incomparable kiteboarding and windsurfing conditions. Windsurfers also flock to the wind and make an annual pilgrimage to Cabarete for the annual World Cup Windsurfing Competition held every June.

Hotels that cater to kiteboarders and windsurfers are dotted along the golden beaches of Cabarete's &Kite Beach. The opportunity to mingle with some the world's greatest athletes and hear tales of catching the perfect wind are around every corner.

The southern coastal waters just west of Santo Domingo are also speckled with the bright colored sails of windsurf boards. But, these are not the only boards to be found in the Dominican Republic. Surf boards also hit the waves in search of the perfect point break and ride on the barrels.



Outdoor Recreation – Kiteboarding, Sandboarding, Surfing & Windsurfing

Kiteboarding

One of the fastest growing water sports, this surfing-like activity uses a huge kite to capture the wind as participants balance on a board. Kiteboarding rentals are available up and down Kite Beach in Cabarete, considered the sport's world capital. Visitors looking to try the sport can easily find experienced kiteboarders offering instruction. A variety of techniques are used at the schools including radio helmets during instruction so immediate feedback is provided to the student for quicker learning and more time on the board.



Sandboarding

Another new sport appearing on the horizon is sandboarding. Requiring a modified snowboard, the sport uses sand as its platform. Two areas in the Dominican Republic are quickly becoming known to sandboarding enthusiasts. One locale is the yellow sand of the Bani Dunes area located in the southwest region about one to two hours west of Santo Domingo. The other area nearby is Las Salinas with approximately 10-square miles of virgin dunes.





Outdoor Recreation – Kiteboarding – Sandboarding - Surfing & Windsurfing

Surfing

Just a five minute car ride outside of Cabarete is Playa Encuentro, a beach known throughout the country for great surfing conditions. Boards and lessons are available through a variety of tour companies in Cabarete. Each provides the board, instruction and transportation to and from Cabarete.

Additional surfing spots include Playas Grande and Preciosa beach just east of Rio San Juan and Playa Boba north of Nagua. These are challenging spots and are recommended for experienced surfers because most do not have a lifeguard.

Several surf camps lasting from one day to two weeks are popping up on the lush north coast. Cabarete's Surf Camp, also known as Ali's Surf Camp, is one of the best known and even offers surf accommodations from cottages to apartments.

Windsurfing

Cabarete of the north coast is considered the world capital of windsurfing. It draws many competitions in the World Cup Windsurfing Competition held every June. Equipment is available for rental through most hotels in the area and lessons can be had through a variety of vendors. Two of the main providers in Cabarete are the Carib Bic Center, which has been providing instruction and boards for nearly 20 years, and Iguana Mama. For those starting out, the calmer waters of the south are an excellent training ground.



Outdoor Recreation – Scuba Diving - Snorkeling & Snuba

The Dominican Republic's underwater world offers exceptional reef diving and snorkeling, incredibly clear waters and a variety of colorful marine life.

In fact, the country is often listed as one of the top diving locations in the Caribbean. Visitors can explore centuries-old shipwrecks on the country's north coast, or take advantage of the warm, protected waters of the south.

While the Dominican Republic is a haven for experienced divers, most allinclusive hotels offer lessons and certification for those interested in learning more about the activity.

What is Snuba? If you're not familiar with Snuba, it is a blend of snorkeling and scuba where the swimmer uses swimfins, a diving mask, weights, and diving regulator as in scuba diving. The air, however, instead of coming from tanks strapped to the diver's back, comes through a long hose from tanks on pontoon rafts on the surface. Snuba often serves as a form of introductory diving, in the presence of a professional, insured guide, and following a half-hour lesson.





Outdoor Recreation – Waterfalls

There are many great locations for waterfalls within the Dominican Republic.

Salto de Jimenoa

Located in Jarabacoa National Park, this 131-foot waterfall is reached by a hiking trail and narrow suspension bridge. The cold water of the Yaque del Norte cascades into the pool below. Lush vegetation surrounds the rocky canyon area. On weekends, a snack bar is open for visitors.

Salto Aqua Blanca

Located in Jarabacoa National Park, this 492-foot waterfall is one of the highest in the Caribbean. Tours are offered through a variety of area operators.

El Limon

Found in the Samana area near the town of El Limon, this stunning waterfall is

accessible by horse. The ride takes two and one-half hours round trip and visitors

can expect to pay \$12. Most excursion outfits will prepare lunch for an additional

nominal fee. As the falls come into sight, the horses are tethered at a small station

where drinks are provided before making the rest of the trek on foot to the swimming

hole at the base of the thundering and picturesque El Limon falls.

Damajagua Falls a.k.a. Cascades of Imbert

Also known as the "seven falls," this is a series of 27 cascades near Puerto Plata. The currents can be strong so it is not recommended for children or weak swimmers. Swim, climb up narrow limestone canyons then jump or water-slide down. Water shoes are suggested because of the slippery conditions.






Outdoor Recreation – Sport Fishing

Most fishing enthusiasts and vacationers to the Dominican Republic aren't aware that the country is one of the best hideouts for dozens of species of sought-after fish. For those who are not looking to become legendary anglers but would like to fight a marlin or reel-in a toothy barracuda, several charters are available throughout the country.

Deep sea fishing arrangements may be made at most resorts throughout the DR. In addition, there are several charters that have fished these waters for decades and know which species are running when and where.





Golfers

A favorite golfing destination of former Presidents Bill Clinton and George H. Bush, the Dominican Republic has become one of the hottest spots to tee-off in the Caribbean, if not the world. Here golfers will find 19 courses with oceanfront fairways and dogleg lefts around swaying coconut palms. They'll also find courses designed by legends such as Pete Dye, P.B. Dye, Jack Nicklaus, Arnold Palmer, Robert Trent Jones, Gary Player, Tom Fazio and Nick Faldo.

Visitors to the Dominican Republic needn't worry about packing golf clubs or even knowing how to golf, for that matter. Each course offers affordable club rentals and internationally recognized golf pros for lessons. Regardless of handicap, the courses of the Dominican Republic promise a challenging and unique experience.

Known for its professional winter baseball, handcrafted cigars, and annual music festivals, the culture of the Dominican Republic is never stodgy, or boring. Art - Baseball - Culture – Museums -Archaeology

The Dominican Republic has a rich and storied history that traces back over 8,000 years to the arrival of the Taino Indians. Following the island's discovery by Christopher Columbus in 1492, the Republic had epic interaction with the Spanish, French, Haitians and Africans. It's no wonder, then, how the Dominican Republic came to boast such an impressive collection of personal and cultural relics from centuries past.

The country has done a magnificent job of maintaining and preserving these artifacts as well as the historical structures in which they're housed. Visiting the Dominican Republic's major cities, especially Santo Domingo, tourists can easily become engrossed in the historical legends that accompany some of the oldest museums and archeological sites in the New World.

The Dominican Republic also has a unique collection of natural rocks and gems that can only be found on the island. Near Barahona, a turquoise-blue pectolite stone known as larimar has been cultivated from the volcanic rock that once formed the island. The country's most popular gem, amber, is the result of tree sap that hardened millions of years ago, sometimes capturing small plants, animals and insects inside. These two geological imprints are used in jewelry, sometimes together and other times in single pieces.

The country's museums and archeological sites intrigue adults and provide a historical lesson for children. From jewelry to religious artifacts, castles to caves, each venue showcases a vastly different aspect of the island's colorful heritage.

Museums in Santo Domingo

- -Museo de las Casas Reales (Museum of the Royal Houses)
 - Once the 16th century governor's Supreme Court, this museum documents Santo Domingo's rich history with tapestries, maps and other artifacts from 1492 to 1821.
- Alcázar de Colón (Castle of Columbus)
 - This palace, including artifacts from the Columbus family, was built in the 1500's by Christopher's son, Diego and his wife.
 - Insider's tip: Following a tour of Alcazar de Colon, venture out onto the Alcazar strip of restaurants and shops to enjoy delicious local fare and atmosphere.
- Museo Del Hombre Dominicano (Museum of the Dominican Man)
 - Set in the Plaza de la Cultura, this museum is reputed to have the country's best collection of pre-Columbian artifacts including jewelry, religious pieces and sculptures. A favorite exhibit explains the effects of African slavery with displays of voodoo artifacts and carnival costumes.
- Museo Nacional de Historia y Geografia (Museum of History and Geography)
 - This museum contains a thorough collection of artifacts that contributed to the country's historical timeline. Displays highlight the DR's first inhabitants, American occupation and interaction with Haiti.
- Museo de Larimar (Museum of Larimar)
 - This new museum explains the island's mining and jewelry industry. Exhibits demonstrate the extraction, shaping and jewelry-making processes of larimar.
- Museo de la Familia Dominicana del Siglo XIX (Museum of the Dominican Family of the 19th Century)
 - Built in 1503, this colonial mansion exhibits artifacts and personal belongings of a 19th century well-to-do Santo Domingo family. While its contents are intriguing, the best part of the museum is the house itself, which has the only double Gothic window in North or South America.

Museums throughout the rest of the Dominican Republic

- Amber Museum
 - This two-story Victorian museum located in Puerto Plata is thought to contain a collection of the world's most transparent amber. Well-preserved plants, insects and animals that were captured in prehistoric tree sap are on display.
 - Insider's tip The Amber Museum contains the famous amber mosquito seen in the box-office hit, Jurassic Park.
- La Isabela Museum
 - A new museum and educational center focusing on Christopher Columbus discovery of Hispaniola in 1492 are in the works and will be housed at La Isabela. The seaside village is the site of adventurer's first settlement in the new world.
- Jewish Museum
 - Located in Sosua, this museum is a tribute to the 700 Jewish refugees taken in by former president Rafael Trujillo in 1938 during the Nazi occupation of Germany. Exhibits showcase photos and personal memorabilia of the settlers and the dairy manufacturing facilities they developed in town.
- Altos de Chavon Regional Museum of Archaeology
 - Located on the Chavon River, this museum boasts a collection of more than 3,000 artifacts from the native Taino Indians who once inhabited the region. You can find it within Casa de Campo in La Romana.

Archaeology

Other than the museums, the Taino Indian sites throughout the country provide insight into pre-Columbian life on the island of Hispaniola.

Caves played an important role in the lives of the Taino Indians. In fact, their creation myth is centered around a cave located on the island. Stories of the Taino interaction with various plants, animals, spirits and each other can be seen in the elaborate pictographs and stone carvings within the structures. Other Taino artifacts are housed at museums and even an excavated burial ground at a local beach.

Passing through the streets of the Dominican Republic visitors are sure to notice the

handmade posters that hang from telephone poles promoting an upcoming merengue or

bachata night at a nearby venue. A way of life on the island, Dominicans view dancing as

an art and take pride in sharing their native movements with others. Other types of dance

music can be heard in the country, but are not as popular as their beloved merengue and

bachata counterparts.

Merengue

- The country's national dance, traditional merengue groups are comprised of a three-piece band including a melodeon (accordion-like instrument), a guira (a scraped percussion piece) and a tambora (double-headed drum); however, it has expanded to incorporate other instruments such as the saxophone, trumpets, violin, flute and piano. Its tempo is characterized by an aggressive beat, requiring its dancers to swing their hips in rapid, fluid motions and make sure their feet follow suit. Its music has become so popular, in fact, that it is honored with two regional festivals each year.

Bachata

 A much slower dance than the merengue, bachata emerged in the rural areas of the island during the 1960s. It was derived from bolero, a music genre native to Cuba, and is compared to country or R&B music of the United States. Originally popular with the poor or lower classes, bachata is characterized by guitar-based melodies rather than large bands.

Music Festivals

Travelers from across the globe journey to the Dominican Republic each year, joining local attendees, for annual music festivals after falling in love with the addictive rhythms.

Beverages

<u>Rum</u>

The Dominican brands of rum (Brugal, Bermúdez, and Barcelo), have become popular across the globe and are considered some of the world's best.

- Bermudez, the eldest of the Dominican rum distilleries, was established in 1852.
- Brugal, established in 1888, is located just east of Puerto Plata and produces more than 1.5 million liters of white and dark rum each year. Tours are offered Monday through Friday and admission is free.
- Barcelo, established in Santo Domingo in 1930, is said to be best-liked by locals. The plant manufactures 40 thousand liters of rum per day.

<u>Beer</u>

Brewed in Santo Domingo, Presidente is the DR's most popular beer and is served at just about every establishment in the country. Presidente beer is a popular souvenir for tourists.

<u>Coffee</u>

The DR's position in the tropics, rainfall levels, and fertile soil make it an ideal location for growing organic coffee beans that provide great taste and a rich aroma. The coffee trade in the DR dates back over 250 years, giving its growers a deep-rooted tradition to continue. The DR has more than 60,000 growers who together export nearly one million bags of coffee per year.








Art, Baseball & Culture - Baseball
